

Lewis Honors College Course Proposal

Honors courses must be approved by the Honors College Council (HCC) as suitable for Honors designation. Previously approved courses, where there have been no significant changes, do not need to be approved by the HCC. Honors courses are also selected based on expected student enrollment and availability of course funding, regardless of whether the course is new or reoccurring.

Specific Honors Details

For HON Sections: Share details about the course assignments (projects, papers, case studies, etc.) that will be used to challenge Honors students. This information helps the committee decide if the course will have the rigor and deliverables suitable for an Honors designation.

For Departmental Sections: Explain how the Honors version of your class will be different from the current course. For example, description of a project, paper, case study, etc. that will be used to challenge your Honors students. This information helps the committee decide if the course will have the rigor and deliverables suitable for an Honors designation.

A CV and TCE for the proposing instructor are also required. A full syllabus must be submitted to the Lewis Honors College with the signed contract, which are due before the first day of classes.

By agreeing to teach an Honors course, faculty also agree to the following:

- The Lewis Honors College offers **course funding**, \$1000 per credit hour to the departments (or equivalent unit) of the faculty teaching Honors seminar courses (HON) or departmental honors sections. Course funding will be transferred to departments during the semester when the course is offered. These funds are intended to compensate the department for the loss of the faculty member's teaching, and can be used at the discretion of the chair (e.g. as payment for a PTI).
- In accordance with GR VII, all faculty teaching an honors course are automatically a part of the Honors Faculty. By accepting this teaching assignment, you are also accepting a position on the Honors Faculty. The Honors Faculty are required to meet once a year and will be asked to vote on important Honors College issues and to interact with honors students at various programs and events.
- All faculty teaching HON courses and departmental honors courses are expected to adhere to Title IV in the same way they would for a course in their own college.
- If your course has honors and non-honors students, all the students are expected to fulfill the full obligations of the Honors course; all will receive honors notation for that class on their transcript.
- Departments are responsible for creating, modifying, and cancelling all departmental Honors courses.
